11:00 am – 12:00 pm	<p>Let’s Make a Deal: Selling Subsidiary Rights Speaker: Barbara Howson, Principal, Howson Consulting</p> <p><i>Subsidiary rights are an important part of the publishing revenue ecosystem, but they are often underdeveloped. Rights can vary from licensing audio books to selling translation rights to film and TV rights. All are different, but all have one similarity and that is they are based on the original published book. This session will offer practical advice on how to exploit these rights successfully.</i></p> <p><i>Barbara Howson is a publishing professional with over thirty years experience. After eight wonderful years as VP of Sales and Licensing at House of Anansi Press and Groundwood Books, she left last summer to start her consulting business which focuses on sales, strategic development, and of course, rights selling. During her tenure at Anansi, Barbara is particularly proud of being instrumental in the licensing of animated film rights for The Breadwinner by Deborah Ellis to Aircraft Pictures, which went on to be nominated for an Academy Award in 2018 and musical theatre rights to The Hockey Sweater by Roch Carrier, which had its debut at Montreal’s Segal Centre in 2017.
